There were good discussions and learning on best way to share individual Trust approaches to PPIE • STP support to delivery, NHS England South Central has a programme approach to supporting delivery. PPI is part of it. • Direct commissioning – submission of 13Q (duty to engage patients and public) forms scrutinised by South Patient Experience leads. • NHS England has an Involvement Hub for participation with resources. Consultation on Policy and expenses policy now closed, outcome not yet published. 	

Clinical Research Networks (CRN)

- OE started at the CRN on February 23
- CRN plans for International Clinical Trials Day on May 20 include media stories in each Thames Valley county and a public talk at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre.
- Investigations are being made to see if social media can be used to promote specific trials.
- The CRN is establishing a database of 'points of contact' which can help get out CRN messages e.g. media, social media and magazines.
- A CRN Facebook has been established.
- A 2-minute film about the CRN will be produced to showcase its work to the public, stakeholders and NHS staff
- Investigations will be made about possible schools outreach.
- The CRN is looking to recruit Patient Research Ambassadors.
- An industry-facing event to encourage joint working will be held in Oxford later in the year.
- The CRN will hold its annual awards ceremony for staff in Sept.

CLAHRC Oxford

- **Involvement** - Theme 3 (Patient Reported Outcomes) led by Professor Ray Fitzpatrick is from now on going to form our PPI steering group. The PPI Strategy is in development with this group.
- PPI Contributor training – BRC, CRN, AHSN, CLAHRC, OUH and OxINMAHR pilot workshop held 15 Mar. Very positive feedback.
- **Engagement:** Oxford Health held a Leading Together event co-produced and delivered by lay partners with lived experience of dementia. The programme was aimed at an audience of professionals, leaders and staff in health and social care services.
- Seminar open to all planned for 4th May at 10.30 in St Lukes Chapel on Radcliffe Observatory Quarter – 'Have you been mis-sold PPI?'
- PPI Pulse, the newsletter for our volunteers previously written by the PPI Coordinator to be developed by the CLAHRC Communications Officer. Next edition going out this week.
- 3rd of the Q & A sessions being held next week – BRC, RDS and CLAHRC will then review – if you have any feedback from staff in your sphere to share let SR or LM know
