Thank you to Douglas for being on the panel with Gary Ford discussing STPs. • ARC bid re-submitted and expect a decision in May. Going ahead with planning assuming a positive! • Launch of national L & D website from INVOLVE that I have been involved in planning and testing – have people used it? Can you feedback? • Q & A sessions – 4 orgs working together on this agreed to change the format so linked to a departmental seminar with a PPI topic covered and half the time devoted to Q & A. Paul attempting to book something this term and Claire next. • Working with two BRCs have developed series of 8 workshops on the research cycle for PPI Contributors in research Jan – Aug. 3 now happened and going well – attracting new people. Large piece of work is our attempt to put it online too! • Progressing action plan for the NIHR PPI Standards • Continue to manage a pool of 150 PPI Contributors, including linking them with researchers to be engaged in front line projects • Continue to offer individual advice and support to research staff on how to involve the public in their work <p>NHS England South East</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NHS England South East has joined the Working Together partnership and will contribute to the Training and Development funding like all the other partners. <p>Oxford BRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Interviews for lay reps for BRC Steering Committee are taking place 14/03/19 – good response and six candidates are being interviewed for two positions. • We have only had nominations from five themes for PPI contributors to join the expanded patient panel (previously known as PAIR). Trying to establish how we can help with this. • Joint training workshops (run with Oxford Health BRC and CLAHRC) for PPI contributors are going well. Three have taken place so far, good attendance and feedback. There are still places on the remaining five – one a month, the next one is 18th April on ‘Carrying out a research study’. • Very belatedly (because of maternity leave) going through GDPR. Hoping we’ll retain about half of our original sign-ups – not as bad a response so far as I’d feared. • BRC Open Day – who is joining the stand? We have Noemi Roy (haematologist) who will do an activity, and should be able to find a patient or two to come along. We are seeing this as a big opportunity for recruiting PPI contributors
